AND, WHEREAS, the CITY has submitted the plan of said plat to EDISON and desires that EDISON install its electric distribution lines for electric underground, single phase, 120/240 volt, three wire, 60 cycle service in easements provided in said plat for service underground to existing business locations fronting on Fort Street between O'Connor Street and Southfield Road and for other business locations as indicated on the plot plan submitted to EDISON.

AND, WHEREAS, in order to accommodate the rearrangement of property lines for the above described plan certain existing lines and poles of EDISON must be removed. The payment for removal of these lines shall not be considered part of this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants herein made between the CITY and EDISON it is hereby agreed:

Responsibility of CITY

- 1. The CITY shall excavate and backfill all of the trenches required for the installation by EDISON of its underground lines in the easements provided without expense to EDISON. Trenches for EDISON's lines shall be separate from water and sewer trenches and the water and sewer services are to be installed prior to installation of EDISON's electric lines.
- Survey stakes indicating property lines must be properly emplaced before and after trenching.
- 3. Easements in plat must have finished grade prior to installation of underground ducts or electrical lines so that electrical distribution service can be properly installed in relation to finished grade.

- 4. All trenching and backfilling required for installation of ducts or direct buried lines in the private easements for public utilities shall be done at the expense of CITY. Location, depth and width of trenches in easements and manner of backfilling to be in accordance with specifications from EDISON. The backfill shall be free of rubble or clods of hard or frozen dirt and shall not contain material which can damage emplaced conduit or direct buried lines.
- 5. CITY will obtain without delay the consent of existing business property owners or tenants on Fort Street to the effect that they will accept underground electric service at the business property line. It is understood and agreed that EDISON will be unable to terminate its existing overhead service until such consent is obtained.
- 6. CITY shall grant to EDISON the right to install its transformers and secondary service pedestals above ground surfaces.

Responsibility of EDISON

Upon completion of the above requirements necessary for the installation of underground electric distribution service, EDISON will furnish, install, own and maintain, at its expense, the ducts, high voltage cables, transformers and secondary connection pedestals located in the easements for public utilities.

Plans are under way to provide the underground electric service that you requested in the Parking Plaza, which is a portion of the above project. This new system will permit removal of the overhead poles and wires when all the customers have made provisions for their underground service.

The Detroit Edison Company had made a claim for reimbursement in connection with the cost of removal and value of remaining life of the overhead lines to be removed. This was estimated to be \$4,092. At that time it was indicated that this situation was related to the "Corktown Case," now pending in the State Supreme Court. Therefore, an agreement delaying the decision on reimbursement was negotiated.

Subsequently, it has been called to our attention that the "Corktown Case" is related only to utility facilities removed from streets and alleys actually vacated. The alley south of Fort between Southfield and O'Connor is not being vacated, and our attorney questions the expediency of including this portion of our claim in the agreement. The estimated cost of the labor to remove these lines and the remaining life of plant, with credit for salvage, is \$2519.

The estimated claim covering the Parking Plaza, under the agreement based on the "Corktown Case" initiated by our office of the Vice President for Civic and Community Affairs, will now be \$1573.

Therefore, we would appreciate your consideration in removing the charges of \$2519 from the \$4092 amount included in the prior agreement and forward to us a purchase order to cover the \$2519 -- for that portion of the work in the alley (not vacated) south of Fort Street.

In addition, please include in the purchase order the amount of \$448 for similar work in O'Connor authorized by you in November 1962 and billed under our invoice \$61752. The two items above total \$2967.

I hope this change will not present any inconvenience to you or the City. Thank you for your cooperation.



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

On January 11, 1963 I met with Mr. L. VanTyle, Mr. W. Huard, Mr. G. L. Murphy and Mr. M. Heidman to discuss a request from the City of Lincoln Park to remove our overhead lines in this project and install underground lines. The following decisions were made:

- 1. The Detroit Edison Company will take the position that it is entitled to reimbursement for removal of its overhead lines which amounts to about \$7,000 after depreciation.
- 2. That the installation of our part of the underground (cable, transformers, pedestals) is equivalent to new overhead lines and therefore would be furnished by Edison without expense to city or customers. The trenching and backfilling would be over and above our overhead installation costs and should be furnished free of cost to Edison.
- 3. The service (underground drop out service from transformer and pedestal) should be furnished by the city or customer including trenching. We would own and maintain these service lines after their original installation. These service lines would require conduit due to paving.

 Transfer of ownership of service lines to Edison would be necessary as customer would have no rights to own and maintain their service lines in public property.
- 4. Easements for our underground should be granted to Edison and Bell for the main services. If the service lines to customers are installed in the public alley, no easements would be required for such lines.
- 5. Mr. Heidman and Mr. Murphy are to contact the City of Lincoln Park and explain our position. The City is to obtain its own figures on cost of trenching, including two-stage backfill, and cost of service wire from pedestal to customer's building.

Dear Mr. Murphy:

As you may know, Lincoln Park's first urban renewal project, the Raupp Fenabilitation Project No. 1, Michigan R-47, is now in final planning. The area is generally bounded by Fort, Russell to Electric, ('Connor to the alley east of Wilson, and Southfield.

As Lincoln Park's planning consultants, we are now developing detailed studies of the proposed renewal plan for submission to the Housing and Home Finance Agency in Chicago. We would, therefore, appreciate it if you could prepare and submit to the Urban Henewal Administrator of Lincoln Park, Mr. Joseph Knowles, a complete cost analysis of the improvements needed in the project area relating to the lighting of alleys, the improvement of existing lighting of streets and any other necessary lighting work involved in accordance with the urban renewal plan and the development plan map. A copy of the proposed development plan map is submitted separately to Mr. A. P. Hollinger.

This map, which we are submitting now, is preliminary but sufficiently detailed to begin your studies. We will submit a new set of maps for your detailed location of new and removal, relocation or other necessary changes to the lighting improvements of the area.

We would appreciate your expediting this matter.


On August 1, 1963 Mr. Phil Wettengell, Attorney for Michigan Bell Telephone Company, informed me that he was told by his Engineering that the City of Lincoln Park was getting ready to go on the new parking plaza. I furnished Mr. Wettengell various papers from our file including the extracts from the Council Meetings of November 19 and December 17, 1962, and also copies of the Urban Renewal Plan. Mr. Wettengell stated that Michigan Bell has not submitted any figures to the City of Lincoln Park as to the cost of removal of its equipment now installed overhead and was in some dispute with the City as to the relocation of its equipment.

I then contacted Mr. Jerry Mudie of our Public and Civic Affairs Department and he stated that he would have Mr. Jerry Murphy call me. I was unable to reach Mr. Murphy until August 6, 1963 and informed him of what had happened and suggested that he contact the City Officials of Lincoln Park to find out how eminent was construction to start. We have heard nothing from the City of Lincoln Park as to what contacts have been made with the adjoining property owners and we do not know whether they are in agreement with re-routing their lines and accepting service from our pedeAtals.
